~ACTING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In June the Ministers Council Personnel Committee will present to the Executive Committee for their vote the nominee for Acting Executive Director. After that vote a press release will announce the name of the candidate. Following a review of six candidates the Personnel Committee has selected the person to serve for two to three years as Acting Executive Director during the constituent Council leadership development phase of Together in Ministry and the American Baptist Churches USA restructuring process. Principal duties for the Acting Executive Director will include constituent Council leadership development and resourcing, leading the Lilly-funded Together in Ministry project, planning for a January 2010 Ministers' Conference, and seeking gifts and bequests to enhance the Ministers Council endowment.

~NEW BAPTIST COVENANT

Message from Jimmy Carter about the gathering: "The New Baptist Covenant Celebration in Atlanta was an overwhelming success, as evidenced by universally positive feedback we have received over the past two weeks. There is a collective yearning to build on the momentum that we have engendered. We will continue to strive for unity, forego any criticism of other Christians, and dedicate ourselves to fulfilling the commitment that Christ made in Luke 4:18-19.

As you know, we do not intend to organize a new convention or official organization that would compete with existing Baptist groups. We are determined, however, in the words of Dr. Jimmy Allen, to have "a movement, not a moment." We will seek opportunities to supplement the work of others and to address some of the problems and opportunities that were discussed during the Atlanta Celebration.

On March 12, leaders of various partner organizations will convene at the Carter Center and begin the process of making decisions about where we go from here. We will keep you updated through the web site - www.newbaptistcovenant.org - and through periodic e-mails."

The Fund for Theological Education provides grants for congregations to cultivate a sense of Christian vocation and call to ministry among youth. Grants are made in amounts ranging from \$5,000 to \$12,000 and are dependent upon the quality and quantity of requests submitted during the application period. Grantees should expend their funds during the eighteen months following the award.
