REFLECTION SERIES ON JEREMIAH 17 & RESILIENCE CONTINUES

Reflections on Jeremiah 17: 7-8

Just prior to sitting down to write this, I collected wet towels from around the church that had been strategically placed to catch the rain coming in from a storm yesterday. I am sure I am not the only minister who will be drying towels tonight, as heavy rains have recently hit many parts of our country. So as I reflect on Jeremiah's words about trees remaining rooted through drought, I'm left to wonder what that means for the floods.



Too often in ministry, we operate out of a mindset of scarcity. The budget is in the red, our congregations are shrinking, we have to "compete" with other Sunday activities, etc. I get it- it is easy to fall into a scarcity mindset in our current reality.

What if, instead of seeing the drought around us, we felt the water soaking up into our roots? What if we didn't see deficiencies, but focused on new opportunities for growth? What if the sparse foliage helped us witness the beauty between the branches?

Let us remember that our roots "reach down to the water" and not "be stressed in time of drought" (Jer. 17:8). Let us feel the water rising and nourishing us, putting on a mindset not of scarcity but of abundance, not of drought but of sufficiency.

God has provided for us; do we have the bravery to see that, or will we default to a worldview of scarcity?



ABHMS Announces Edwin T. Dahlberg Peace and Justice Award

American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) is pleased to announce that the **Rev. Dr. Michael Nabors**, pastor, Second Baptist Church, Evanston, Ill., and the **Rev. Dr. Michael Woolf**, pastor, Lake Street Church, Evanston, Ill., were awarded the Edwin T. Dahlberg Peace and Justice Award for outstanding work for peace and justice.

ABCUSA named the denomination's Peace and Justice Award for Edwin T. Dahlberg to honor his unflagging commitment to Christian discipleship. In 1964, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was the first recipient. The award was presented at the 2023 Biennial Mission Summit in San Juan, Puerto Rico, in June.
