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Blessed are those...whose trust is the Lord. They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit. (Jer. 17.7-8)

I have read these words over and over again this year, as they have been a focus of our national Ministers Council leadership team. These last few weeks, though, the line that sticks out to me is "It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green." It has been a dry couple of months here in Kansas. That's not too unusual in the summer, but we had a pretty wet June and July. So when the heat indices soared over 130



degrees in August, and everything dried up in September, we noticed! Watching the stressed and prematurely yellow leaves cover the ground in our backyard gives me a newperspective on "fear when heat comes."

Perhaps you can relate? How many of us struggle through dry seasons in ministry, feeling isolated, overworked, embattled, or stuck in the middle of political fights in the pews? Like the stressed and embattled tree sending out its roots, what are your strategies for seeking the life-sustaining groundwater of God's good grace and peace? It is time to put together a Together in Ministry group, or revive one that has stopped meeting in the last few years? Is it time to connect online with national organizations such as the Ministers Council, through programs of collegiality (see below for a few coming up!) It is time for a spiritual retreat? A vacation? A real day off?

I believe that the groundwater is there, and I believe that we are each given the ability to reach it. But, like the tree whose leaves stay green, it might be up to us to stretch our roots in a different direction, or just go deeper. Siblings in Christ, if this is a year of drought for you, let's work together, not ceasing to bear fruit.



Please pray for Rev. Dr. Myers and her family and friends in the coming days, that she might know the Spirit of God walking beside her.



VALLEY FORGE, PA (9/26/23)—**American Baptist Home Mission Societies** (ABHMS) extends heartfelt thanks to the **Christian Community Credit Union (CCCU)** for a gratefully received \$5,000 donation to the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) fund for the survivors of the Maui wildfires. Though authorities revised the number of fatalities downward in mid-September from 115 to 97, the conflagration remains the deadliest wildfire in the United States in more than a century.
