
You crown the year with your goodness, and your paths overflow with plenty. - Psalm. 65:11

Jeremiah 17:7-8

Blesssed are those who trust in the LORD, Whose trust is the LORD. They shall be like a tree planted by water, Sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, And its leaves shall stay green; In the year of drought it is not anxious, And it does not cease to bear fruit.



I recently traveled to Western Pennsylvania and stood beside the Youghingheny River. It was a powerful river, especially on the rainy day I was there, and it is often used for white water rafting. Yet, my eyes were drawn to the trees growing by the water, and I could sense their limbs spreading out tall and strong and their roots growing down towards the stream. The roots were growing out and down, going down deep, collecting nutrients and water, even in this autumn time of the year. I could see that that river, the stream, was always present and ready for those roots that spread out and reached down.

The passage from Jeremiah reminds us that we too can be like the trees by this river, sending out our roots by the stream. And the wonderful thing is that God

is always there. It takes some trust to reach out; hoping and believing that the nourishment will be there. The tree roots grow deep in the ground and sometimes it feels like darkness for us as well. We don't see the light and it may feel cold. Yet, God is present. Nourishment is available. God's grace, God's mercy, God's love is always obtainable. We do not need to be anxious; we just need to reach out.



My prayer is that we all continue to trust in our God and to reach out. To find God's nourishing goodness in a walk in the out of doors, through a conversation with a friend, in a quiet prayer and meditation time, though the singing of songs, while reading the Scriptures, or the many other things that we can do to reach out to our ever-present God. Trust – for God is with us.

CONTINUING COVENANT: Inviting Feedback on the Code of Ethics and Covenant Learning Guide" NOVEMBER 16, 2023 5pm Pacific/7pm Central/8pm Eastern

In February of this year, the Ministers Council officially began using the updated language for our revised Code of Ethics and Covenant. This was the pinnacle of a process that included several listening sessions and chapters' approval, guided by a diverse team over the course of several years. The ultimate goal of that team was to accompany the Code of Ethics with a **Learning Guide**, a longer document which allowed for more thoughtful reflection upon the ideas in the Code of Ethics. Since February, we have been eliciting feedback and responses about what might be included in the Learning Guide.

On **Thursday, November 16** at 8:00pm Eastern Time, two members of that team want to invite YOUR feedback, as a part of that process. Mary D. Miller, Executive Minister of the ABC of Massachusetts, and Jerrrod H. Hugenot, Associate Executive Minister of the ABC of New York State, will host the session, sharing a summary of the process, and inviting conversation around the document. As a part of our ongoing work toward collegiality, competence, and centeredness, we will share space together to think about how we might continue our covenant with one another as ministers in this time and place.
