


### February 2024 Newsletter

The church was **founded in 1777** to host the First Black Baptist congregation members in North America organized in 1773. The creation of this church can be majorly attributed to **George Leile**, an African-American man who was still enslaved back in 1773. That year, he became the first Black man licensed to preach to the plantation slaves in the state of Georgia. ### Hope.



**Dr. Richard K. Gladden**, 92, former deputy general secretary for Research and Planning for American Baptist Churches USA, died on Friday, November 17, 2023, at Warren Memorial Hospital, Front Royal, Va.

Gladden retired on June 30, 1996, after a denominational career of 34 years. For more than a quarter century Gladden was a strategic resource person for the ABCUSA Office of the General Secretary, General Board and other American Baptist boards and agencies. He researched, wrote on, and provided expert advice in such matters as the denomination's polity, bylaws and standing rules, policy planning, evaluation and assessment of programming. He served as staff to the denomination's Standing Rules Committee, Planning and Evaluation Committee and Reference Committee.

American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) is pleased to provide up to forty debt-relief grants of \$5,000 to American Baptist pastors who engage with financial education and are accessing these grants for the first time.

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- · Pastors must currently be serving American Baptist congregations.
- · Ordained, licensed, and lay pastors are all eligible to apply.
- · Pastors serving in all capacities are eligible (youth, associate, senior, solo, bivocational, etc.).
- Pastors must commit to and complete one of three learning "tracks" before receiving the grant.

Note: These grants can be used for consumer, medical, student loan, or other debt identified in your application. Funds received are taxable as income.
