A Pastoral Reflection from the President

Is it Time to Lie Fallow?

Six years you shall sow your land and gather in its yield, but the seventh year you shall let it rest and lie fallow...(Exodus 23.10-11, NRSV)

While the above command from God at Sinai might seem oddly practical and theologically irrelevant, it was actually a profoundly theological statement. The Israelites had previously only known the rule of the Egyptian



Empire, designed to maximize production regardless of the effect on the land or especially on the enslaved workers. So, when the command came that the Israelites must in effect *waste* an entire growing year, it must have felt jarring. And yet, God knew that for the well-being of the land long-term, it must for a time lie fallow. Be left alone for entire growing season....

Rest.

God was explaining that Sabbath rest is the way that all of creation operates. This year, our Leadership Team is exploring the concept of God's new thing springing up. Exodus reminds us that for a new thing to pop out of the ground, that ground must lie fallow for a time. The same is true for us. In fact, the very next verse in Exodus reminds the Israelites of this truth: *Six days you shall do*

your work, but on the seventh day you shall rest... (Exodus 23.12)

...you shall rest...

How is it time for you to lie fallow? Is the summer a slower time for your ministry, and a chance to take that long-needed vacation? Has your ministry been moving along at the speed of Empire for so long that it is time for a more intentional sabbatical? Our June 20 MC Live will explore "God's Invitation: Sabbaticals & Sabbath-Minded Ministry," featuring Travis Norvell, Jacki Belile and others for a panel on the importance of keeping "sabbath-minded." And on July 10, we will hold a session for folks about grants for Together in Ministry (peer groups) which could help create space for collegiality and rest. Each of these are invitations to help you think about how you and your ministry might lie fallow for a time. It may be what you both need for that "new thing" to spring up!

Retired Ministers and Small Churches Thriving Together

I am a retired American Baptist minister living in central New York State. Several years ago, a person whom I knew in a church where I served as a shortterm interim contacted me to ask if I would consider serving a church very part-time by leading its worship service on the "odd" Sundays - the first, third, and if there is a fifth, that Sunday also. That was it. This is a small United Church of Christ that cannot afford a full-time minister but is able to pay two ministers per diem to prepare the worship service and lead and preach on designated Sundays. Attendance hovers around 15-20 persons. Communion is served the first Sunday of the month, and a coffee hour is held after that Communion service. The people are gracious and appreciative of the leadership that the other minister and I give and do not expect more than leadership at the worship services for which each of us is responsible. However, if a need arises for pastoral care, they know they can call upon us, and we will respond. So...preparing a sermon every other week isn't so bad, and it keeps my mind working. And because there are two of us preaching every other Sunday, we try to stick to the Lectionary so we do not duplicate each other. It is a wonderful arrangement for the church and a couple of older pastors who enjoy a limited commitment. Oh, by the way, the other minister who does the "even" Sundays is a retired United Methodist - and both of us are serving this small, rural UCC church. I'd call this a wonderful arrangement for the small church and some older ministers. I'm sure this could work in some small American Baptist churches.

National Updates

LEARNING GUIDE UNDERWAY FOR CODE OF ETHICS

The Ministers Council is turning in coming months to conclude the publication of a Learning Guide designed to be a companion to our national "Covenant and Code of Ethics." (The 2006 version of the COE was updated through a three-year process from 2019-2022 and became effective 2/1/23.)

The diverse eight-member editorial team collaborated for 15 months on the Learning Guide, which was shared in "beta version" with a couple gatherings in 2023 - an online "MC Live" session and a session of the Executive Ministers at the Biennial Mission Summit. Focus groups are being scheduled now with our denominational caucuses before its release this Fall. See a preview document highlighting the editorial team, processes and an excerpt HERE. 


