Keeping Watch from the High Tower

The prophets often speak of the watchman on the high tower—a figure stationed where the horizon meets the sky, looking out for what is coming. Habakkuk says, "I will stand at my watch and station myself on the ramparts; I will look to see what God will say to me" (Habakkuk 2:1).



In ministry, we are called to a similar posture— attentive to the movements of God, alert to the needs of God's people, and aware of the world's changing winds. But biblical "watching" is not simply about scanning for danger; it is a balanced rhythm of rest, sustainability, wisdom, vigilance, and action.

- **Rest** Even the watchman sleeps. Elijah, after his long night of confrontation and fear, was met by God with food, water, and time to rest (1 Kings 19:5–8). Without rest, our watch grows clouded and our vision blurs.
- **Sustainability** The watchman's task is ongoing. Long obedience requires pacing ourselves, stewarding our bodies, minds, and spirits so

we can remain faithful for the long road (Isaiah 40:31).

• **Wisdom** – Wisdom is what allows us to discern between the passing shadow and the true approach of God's call. Solomon prayed for "a discerning heart" (1 Kings 3:9)—we pray the same as we watch.

- **Vigilance** Like Nehemiah's builders who worked with one hand and held a weapon in the other (Nehemiah 4:17), vigilance keeps us alert and ready to respond.
- **Action** Watching is not an end in itself. When the watchman sees the dawn or the danger, they sound the trumpet (Ezekiel 33:6). Seeing must lead to doing—bearing witness, speaking truth, and moving forward.

Ministry in our time requires the high tower perspective—eyes lifted, spirit attuned, feet grounded. We keep watch not out of fear, but in hope. We stay awake because we trust that God is at work, and we want to be ready to join in.







Rev. Betty Wright-Riggins is an American Baptist ordained minister and the Principal (CEO) of TrustOne Ministries, a ministry of Spiritual Direction/Spiritual Formation, Church Consultancy and Congregational Transformation.

She currently serves as the Chaplain and Director of Religion and Spiritual Life at Ursinus College and is an adjunct professor at Eastern University, teaching Christian Spirituality. She is a spiritual director on staff at the Middleton Counseling Center in Bryn Mawr, PA and provides spiritual direction at The Common Place in Philadelphia, PA. Rev. Betty is a lecturer and was facilitator of practice at Oasis Ministry for Spiritual Development, and spiritual director to staff and students at Princeton Theological Seminary.

Rev. Betty engages an active spiritual director practice and leads retreats. She is a contributor to the recentlypublished book, "Kaleidoscope: Broadening the Palette in the Art of Spiritual Direction," and the classic, "Those Preaching Women, Volume 1." She often teaches and lectures in the areas of spiritual direction practice, spiritual formation, spiritual disciplines and African American Spirituality.

Rev. Dr. Patricia Murphy is the Ecclesiastical Endorser for American Baptist Churches USA, giving leadership to the American Baptist National Network of Chaplains, Pastoral Counselors and Specialized Ministers and the National Coordinator of Chaplains, Pastoral Counselors and Specialized Ministers at American Baptist Home Mission Societies.

She is a Board-Certified Chaplain (APC) with experiences as a Palliative Care & Protestant Chaplain, Bio Medical Ethicist, and with Labor Relations. She is the chair for the Association of Religious Endorsing Bodies (AREB), a Member-at-Large of the National Conference Military and Armed Forces (NCMAF) and chair of the Executive Committee for Veterans Affairs Chaplains (ECVAC).

Dr. Murphy has also served as a national conference facilitator on racial trauma, bio-medical ethics, palliative care, leadership practices, ministry and vocation beyond the pulpit, and has discussed topics with respect to pastoral counseling, chaplaincy, and spiritual direction.
